MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE BOARD

As a member of the Board of Trustees of Onesimo Foundation for many years, I have seen how the ministry has grown from a small, modest beginning up to what it is at present. There is no doubting that everything happened because God is at the helm of the ministry. It is likewise noteworthy that the team is composed of people who have been around for many years, who, even with the difficult work of ministering to young people whose lives have been broken with abuses, neglect, deprivation, have served with dedication and perseverance. It is also remarkable that support for the work has been sustained through the indefatigable effort of our OFI's founding director and the team he works with. Through their hard work, individuals, churches and organizations have committed to support OFI ministries.



It is no wonder that much has been accomplished in 2019 as shown in this annual report. We are especially grateful that the residential centers have been given accreditation by the Department of Social Welfare and Development. It is a major accomplishment considering the stringent standard of this government agency. The construction work of the Multi-Purpose Building in Matalinting Farm has likewise commenced in April, a truly huge undertaking for the organization.

In September, I facilitated the team's annual evaluation and planning. I noted two developments during the process worth mentioning – each department came up with more judicious budget and a collective aspiration to seriously explore how support could be generated locally.

Was this an indication of a significant shift in the organization's mindset? I am writing this message in the 4th week of enhanced community quarantine in Metro Manila and the rest of Luzon which is now extended for another 3 weeks. The fight against COVID-19 is an unprecedented occurrence and every nation, poor, developed and rich are all battling against this public health crisis. While health gets priority, governments especially of poor nations like the Philippines have to deal with helping people meet basic needs to survive and how to ensure that economy will be saved. I wonder how things would be for OFI after the crisis? May the Lord find us in OFI fully trusting and depending on Him.

Let me end this message with Isaiah 43:18-19.

Giving them education makes difference! We had ground breaking for the much-awaited Multipurpose building and construction is in full progress.



Thank you very much for the generous donation of many individuals and groups who untiringly helping Onesimo continue its mandate to reach the children and youth at risk through its various programs. In 2019, we were able to give service to

91 youth at risk ages 13 to 18 in our 6 Residential Care facilities

343 youth at risk ages 18 to 24 with our Community Based Ministry Rehabilitation program

602 children and youth ages 5 to 15 in a 4-day Daily Vacation Bible School

334 urban poor youth ages 13 to 24 in the 5-day long camp, 4 batches

190 parents through our Parents' Enrichment Camps

58 youth leaders from different churches in an urban poor area were trained through Youth Leadership Training Program

28 youth through our Community-Based Scholarship

30 youth through our Aftercare Program,

and around one thousand people from urban cities were given orientation on Farming Program.

Let us be encouraged to witness the youth at risk once, directionless, hopeless, an eyesore to the society now transformed into a youth with a dream, hopeful and led back to the mainstream, now productive. Youth from boys' town, finished the program and now starting to give back, serving the Lord and contribute to the economy.

CHURCH BASED MINISTRY PARTNER CHURCHES

Onesimo Foundation pioneered its Church Based Minstry Program in 2012 and has been operating for 8 years. Onesimo as resource agency targets to partner with urban poor community churches to run its 2 year pattern of program: Reach, Rehabilitate, Equip and Mobilize. It was based on the story of Onesimo who become a prisoner and being reached out by Apostle Paul because of theft incident. He became a disciple and equipped by Paul through the word and message, and when the time comes Paul vouched Onesimo who formerly a useless one become a good and useful person to his friend Filemon. The program runs like his character and transformed life. We partnered and through churches together with pastors and workers who implement the program, youths-at-risk were being reached and help them have transformed lives and become a useful one with their families and communities.

It is an alternative for the long time running program of Onesimo which is the Residential Care whom we cater minor aged youths. CBM targeted those youth-at-risk whose ages are 18 years and above.

This year, a total of 37 churches committed to partner with us to care for the poor youth at risk.

REACH/PREVENTION

ONESIMO'S CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

In all of Onesimo's programs and activities, we aim to protect children from all forms of abuse by our staff, volunteers and other persons who come in direct contact with the children under our care. We take decisive action in the case of an incident of abuse in cooperation with the appropriate authorities.

Onesimo believes that clients, beneficiaries and program participants have the right to speak, to be heard and to participate in all decisions concerning them.

OUTREACH PROGRAM

Crucial in the whole project implementation of Onesimo Foundation, Inc. is its community outreach program. All year round, staff and volunteers in partnership with some local churches, conducts regular outreach work around the surrounding area of Metro Manila. Its primary objective is to establish rapport with all prospective Work Camp candidate/trainee through friendship evangelism and community service including visits to their families

SUMMER YOUTH CAMP

We thank the Lord for His work through our Summer Camps this year. The life moving testimonies and sharing of our young leaders as they handle their group made a big impact. Indeed, by God's grace we were able to finish our 5 weeks camp. Along with our church partner this year Luzon Living Faith Church, Community Christian Antioch Church, Christ's Light Ablaze in You and our Onesimo Outreach. Although we had one Church who cancelled their slot due to lack of Leadership to handle the camp.

REACH/PREVENTION

LEADERSHIP TRAINING

Last week of the year in Puerto Galera 3 new churches and 2 last term churches participated in the yearly training joined by selected youth from the Residential centers were trained to lead our upcoming SYCO 2020.

Although there was a storm that hindered our original schedule, we are thankful that the Lord kept us safe and in His time He makes all things beautiful. A total of 73 youth leaders were trained to handle our 2020 Summer Youth Camp.

COMMISSIONING DAY

Before the jumpstart of our camps we were able to gather for fellowship and pray for one another. Aware that there will be challenges ahead, we still kept the faith because the Lord has already prepared the way for the success of camps.

It was held at Onesimo Main Building last March 9, 2019 participated by around 89 youth leaders, pastors and some Onesimo staff. The pastors also shared words of encouragement to our youth leaders.



CHURCH BASED MINISTRY SUMMER CAMP

A venue to enhance their leadership skills and one of the most unforgettable experiences of youths in the 2-year program, where they experience the Lordship of Christ through different topics discussed by pastors, Recreational activities handled by workers and through a very relaxing ambiance of nature at Camp Rock, Puerto Galera.

A summer program to enhance the leadership skills of 136 former youth at risk, facilitated by 42 church volunteers and 8 CBM Staff.





DAILY VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL (DVBS) 602 CHILDREN/YOUTH BENEFITED

Yearly, when school is out, Onesimo conducts DVBS in communities where the residential centers are located. This is an opportunity for the residential clients especially the *Ates* and the *Kuyas* to teach the children in their communities from toddlers to grade-schoolers about the great themes of the Bible in ways attractive to the young. Hundreds of children flock to the centers.

It is a two-way purpose for both the children and the youth. First, for the children to be introduced to Jesus. This early intervention hopefully directs the children's lives toward good and away from bad influences. Second, it is part of the youth's training and exposure to the community and to help them realize their significance in the lives of others especially to the young ones.

WORK CAMP

Work Camps are the introduction of new trainees into the Onesimo System. Whatever addictions or habits the children have are cut off by bringing them to a remote place where they have no opportunity to indulge themselves. So there are no opportunities for cigarettes, alcohol, drugs, computers, sex or gambling. During Work Camps, there are good clean physical activities to allow them to sweat out any toxins from their bodies. Games, fellowship, bible studies, group discussions, sleep and rest on time replace all other harmful activities from their previous lives.

RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM

Work Camps were held at two different places of Onesimo. The boys and girls' first week was held at Onesimo's Matalinting Farm and Camp, while the following week was held at Camp Rock, Puerto Galera. The victorious trainees were distributed among the Boys and Girls Residential Centers to enter into the second phase of their training, the 6-month All of Life Discipleship Training.

REACH/REHABILITATION

CHURCH BASED MINISTRY

The Church Based Ministry program was on its 8th year and still passionate with reaching out to the urban poor youth-at-risk. The Work Camp was held from July 15 to 21, 2019 and July 29 to August 2, 2019 at Onesimo Farm and Campsite in Matalinting Sta. Maria, Laguna.


Out of 17 partner churches (new and renewed) 14 of them outreached a total of 111 youth to join the week-long Work Camp activity. While the 3 partner churches continued in reaching youth at risk within their respective communities.




ACCEPTANCE RITES

The Acceptance Rites is a formal ceremony for the youths (residential and church-based) who have successfully completed their respective Work Camps and elected to continue with the program. Residential and CBM conduct separate events. The ceremony gives the new trainees a sense of accomplishment and affirms the difficult decision to pursue this life change. Each one gets a lighted candle symbolizing new life and a token gift as a remembrance of the event. Houseparents and pastors welcome their new wards and pray for strength and grace as they collectively embark on the journey.

All thirty-six (36) outreached youth for residential care who attended the 2-week long Work Camp decided to go through the rehabilitation program. They all joined and were welcomed by Onesimo in Acceptance Rites.



One hundred eleven (111) outreached youth joined the Work Camp, but eight (8) of them decided to leave after. But, before the Acceptance Rites twenty-two (22) more youth were outreached and admitted. A total of one hundred twenty-five (125) youths were officially accepted at Onesimo CBM Program.



PARENTS ORIENTATION

As we accepted new batch of trainees, we also had an orientation with their families and guardians on their responsibilities and the importance of their role as a family in the lives of these youth. They were also informed of the services and programs their children will be undergoing and they are encouraged to join retreats, family dialogue, and bonding activities that will be conducted. This would be a big help for them as parents and guardians on how to guide their children .

REACH/REHABILITATION

ALL OF LIFE GRADUATION

In the All of Life Discipleship Program we have batch of new trainees trained for 6 months. Together we worked out for the trainees to recover from sickness or malnutrition and enjoy good health, shown determination to break free from substance abuse and other vices, developed personal hygiene

habits, get along with other trainees and had manifested greater interest in knowing the God of the Bible. Thus, beginning to sense their purpose in life, learn the housekeeping chores and recognize their talent, inclinations, and abilities.

Graduation is a milestone for all of us! All the 36 residential youth who joined this phase successfully graduated. Ceremony was held at Trade Union Congress of the Philippines, joined by their families and friends and of course we in Onesimo rejoiced with them.





SPORTS FEST

This year, we had our first training for volleyball referees participated by 7 Onesimo staffs and 1 reintegrated youth. With the help of KINGS group, they were able to conduct training last October 19, 2019 at Onesimo Building. This would benefit our sportsfest every year and we thank the Lord for this privilege to learn new things and apply it on our program.

REACH/REHABILITATION

FAMILY RETREAT

Most Onesimo children are products of dysfunctional families. Onesimo knows that family must also be part of the child's life change. Annual Family Retreats are held to share Christ's forgiveness and grace. The family is given an understanding of what their child is going through. So together, child and their family can reconcile and re-commit to one another. This helps immensely when the child comes home

after the 2-year program to have a better family environment.

In four batches of family retreat, there were a total of 190 families participated and bonded with their respective child, Onesimo trainees. It's teary to witness their being reconciled to one another.

YOUTH GATHERING

These activities create bridges of cooperation between the barangay (village) and the churches, showcasing the benefits of harnessing the Youth at Risk. Citizens and officials of barangay become aware of the ministry of churches for youth at risk, promoting the CBM program and Onesimo.

ALTERNATIVE LEARNING SYSTEM

INSTRUCTIONAL MANAGERS TRAINING & WORKSHOP

Another five-day seminar and workshop on Alternative Learning System was conducted last January 21 to 25, 2019. As the number of out-of-school youths increase, we want to promote an alternative way that will provide educational opportunities to our marginalized brethren and urban poor church partners' by training them to be one of ALS Instructional Manager. With the help of our facilitators from DepEd NCR headed by Dr. Felicino Trongco along with his team Dr. Orger Morallos, Dr. Josefino Pugoy Jr. and Dr. Jennifor Aguilar we were able to train 25 of new teachers for ALS.

FUNCTIONAL LITERACY TEST

Alternative Learning System use Functional Literacy Test before the start of the class to assess the learners' functional literacy. This test is consists of two parts; the demography information sheet and the functional literacy test proper. For the result, there were 7 clients in Basic Literacy Program, 17 in Elementary and 32 in Secondary. It was participated by the new trainees to enter the ALS program for this year.

After the FLT exam the ALS for new and old trainees was held last January 9, 2019. they were also given school supplies, uniforms which they could use for the whole year. The teachers also discussed the rules and regulation in the class.



MOCK REVIEW AND ALS EXAMINATION

The District Division conducted a review before the actual exam of ALS on February 16 and the exam was February 24 at New Era High School. There were 22 Secondary and 21 Elementary who took the review and the annual examination.

During the Annual Planning, there were seven Proposed Skills Training Courses, but in the second quarter of 2019 based on the number of possible enrollees we reduced the Skills Courses to open (Massage and Reflexology, Housekeeping and Bread and Pastry Production).




PELT RETREAT LEVEL 1

We held Skills Training Graduation at Bible Baptist Church at 4 Rd 12, Project 8, Quezon City last Oct. 31, 2019 with about 156 people attended the said program. There were 11 graduates from Bread and Pastry Production, 17

graduates from Housekeeping and 6 graduates from Massage and Reflexology. Our theme was "Tiwala'y buo, Pusong pursigido; Pangarap noon, Pagsisikap ngayon, Tagumpay sa darating na panahon." with the verse Proverbs 21:5 "The thoughts of the diligent tend only to plenteousness; but of every one that is hasty only to want."



EVENTS HIGHLIGHTS

The best part of the event was when every staff of Onesimo Foundation Inc. sang a song for the graduates titled "Sasamahan kita" by Quest and we gave them their prepared graduation picture as a souvenir. The lyrics of the song and its connection to the staff as they sang it melted the heart of the students.

Another highlight was their guardians' presence in their graduation. There were 21 awardees that really worked hard and proved themselves capable of the challenge. Lastly, was our guest speaker who encouraged well not just the graduating student but all of the people who attended the Elite Mrs. Philippines International 2019 Michelle Vitug Encarnacion congratulated the graduates of 2019.

MOBILIZE

This is the last phase of the Onesimo Foundation's program. It is a one and a half year preparation of the clients' return to their parents and community. In this status, the clients should be living independently and differently from the life they had before entering the program.

AFTER CARE PROGRAM

In Aftercare, we want to make sure that our beneficiaries are functional after their training in Onesimo. We are trying to help them to continue their dreams even after the program in the Residential facilities.

There were 36 beneficiaries under this program, where 18 of them were reintegrated in 2019 and 18 in 2018. Through the guidance of this program, they continue despite the struggles in life due to poverty and peers' bad influence but manage to keep trying hard to stay in school and pursue their dreams. Before the end of the year 9 were discharged, leaving 27 beneficiaries under this program.

"Facing the Giants" is a popular movie in 2006; it is a very inspirational movie. In the Aftercare program, we identified boys who are brave in life. The first one is **Onel Lorica**, 22 years old and residing in Tinajeros, Malabon City. He stayed in the program last 2016 under Tondo Center. Onel was elementary level and tried hard to uplift his situation in life. He enrolled in short courses like housekeeping, electrical & welding and small engine.

In 2018, he graduated in the program and has never been afraid to face the truth of life. He used his skills in housekeeping and improved it to have decent work. He used to work as painter and cleaner at Sct. Rallos in Tomas Morato Quezon City.

He fetched his family from the street and rent a small

space in Malabon. Onel said that his life was not easy but he was more inspired to push forward to help his small siblings who are depending on him. He was thankful to Onesimo for the assistance and love that he experienced even until he was out of the program. He chose to look forward in life and does not want to blame his parents or other people for their situation. He was focus to strive hard and move forward

The courageous 20 year old is **Angelo Galindes** and formerly stayed at Bagong Silang Center. He is now in Grade 9 under Alternative Deliver Mode at Kalayaan High School in Bagong Silang Caloocan City. Since his schedule is only every Wednesday he use the other days to find jobs that would help his high school needs and family as well. And in his free time he helps Tatay Richard as volunteer in the center. Last December 2019 he was hired as a helper in construction site along Central Avenue, Culiat, Quezon City. He endured the demands of his work because he wants to help his family since his parents sells goods in Divisoria so they don't have a regular income.

Angelo improved in many ways. Ways he also takes care of his siblings while his parents are away. He

knew that his parents have limited capacity and he wanted to help them. He also encourages his siblings to have an education despite their financial constraints. He is now saving money to acquire the birth certificate of his younger siblings.

Angelo was thankful to Onesimo for the training and knowledge that was imparted to him which became very useful at home.

MACABUD COMMUNITY

Through the years, Onesimo Foundation Inc. cultivates different teenagers in the Philippines. The organization has a big heart in helping less fortunate teenagers to uplift their situation in life.

This year, the program of Aftercare wants to help through prevention of young people getting involves in early marriage, premarital sex and other antisocial activities so the management of Onesimo try to venture once again in scholarship program among children in the mountain of Macabud to reach out and give a chance to have decent life ahead.

Onesimo had partnership in the community church (Fruitful Life Christian Church) led by Pastor Rodel Alcantara to facilitate the whole activity of 2019. He recommends certain people that he thinks in-need of help in terms of education assistance while he gives spiritual coaching in each family. The program started last May 18, 2019 for the 28 families.

The swimming construction will start before the year end and will hopefully be finished by May 2020, just in time for MPB to finish and the landscaping/beautification/gate and riprap of the access road to MPB.

These facilities will add to charisma of OFC and in order to serve well all our visitors/campers.

Thank you to kuya Eugene Villanueva who sponsored part of piping needs with Crown Asia Chemical Corp's materials. Also to Mr. and Mrs Brumann who generously gave for the swimming pool.

FARMING DEVELOPMENT

Farming development is on its high performance level.

Two more goat houses were built, and now with 29 heads and 4 female goats soon ready for milking. We are now milking goats. We are exploring milk by products and supply milk to our own Onesimo coffee

shop. Development of goat milk (bottled fresh milk or cheese) and fruit by products (jam or jelly) for Farm to Table restaurant/Onesimo Cafe

We aim to produce more vegetables for our Onesimo Carinderia starting January 2020. Hence, we built a greenhouse with our own design and do it ourselves construction this year.

TRAINING PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

In the training side: We have two farm trainees: one for a one year course and one who have recently started a three month basic farming course. We are looking forward to possibly next year, for a process of OFC becoming an accredited training arm of Agricultural Training Institute (ATI).

GLOSSARY OF ONESIMO TERMS

Onesimo, OFI – Names for The Onesimo Foundation, Inc.

Residential – Onesimo's residential program. It was and remains Onesimo's showcase program, where youth-at-risk or in-conflict with the law with ages from 14 to 18, are cared for in a specially designed 2-year course. Since the youth are minors, Onesimo complies with all Philippine government regulations for the care of minors. All facilities, personnel, and aspects of the program are carefully monitored to provide the best care for our young clients.

CBM – Church Based Ministry. A major Onesimo Program for adult youth, eighteen (18) years old and above. Churches in urban-poor communities partner with Onesimo to oversee to Reach, Rehabilitate, Equip and Mobilize them through a structured 2-year program. Onesimo acts as resource provider and the churches provide manpower, and venue.

Trainee – Usually a youth in the first year of the Onesimo (2-year) Program.

Beneficiary – Term used for a youth in the CBM program. Used to differentiate from a youth enrolled in the Residential Program.

Client – Term used for a youth in the Residential program. Used to differentiate from a youth enrolled in the CBM program.

Kuya, Ate – literally, elder brother (*kuya*) and elder sister (*ate*). In the Onesimo Residential Program, the terms are given to clients who have completed the first year of the two year program. The *kuyas* and *ates* help take responsibility for guiding trainees through their first steps in the program. At Work Camp, they instruct the new ones in the new life, expectations, do's and don'ts. At the Residential centers, they serve as models for the trainees. During summer youth camps, the *Kuyas* and *Ates* augment the church youth leaders and are given opportunities to exercise their gifts.

Community Day – A Community Day is held twice a year, in February and August. Traditionally, an Onesimo wide outing, bringing clients, beneficiaries, staff and church/youth workers on educational tours to manufacturing plants and theme parks for experiences they will treasure.

Summer Youth Camps with Onesimo - Also known as SYCO (pronounced siko with a short 'I'). Started as Super Youth Camps with urban-poor youth invited from various slum communities in Metro Manila Now as implemented by Onesimo, partner churches from urban poor communities host week long summer camps at Onesimo's Camp Rock Retreat Center in the famous Puerto Galera beach town in Mindoro island. Onesimo trains camp leaders, and heavily subsidizes camp fees so that urban poor youth may experience God's beautiful creation while being taught God's Word through tailored activities designed to challenge Youth to leadership roles in church and community. Planning for the camps and training of leaders start in November and December of the prior year. Coordination meetings for churches and commissioning of youth leaders (including strict understanding of the Onesimo Child Protection Policy) continue in January and February of the Camp Year. Partnership with churches may go on for 5 years unless terminated due to subperformance or violations of Onesimo policies.

Aftercare Program – This follow up program seeks to help residential clients fully adapt to family life in their own communities after the 2-year residency has been completed. It consists of a senior Social Worker and an experienced community worker.

PELT – Personality Enhancement and Leadership Training 2 year parallel training to Skills and Academics also administered by the OAEP. It has psychological and spiritual components augmenting discipleship which takes place in the residential centers.
