Parola is a dark and hidden place, built into the dirty sea water of Manila Bay, alongside the "Pier Dose" in Tondo. It is home for hundreds of families and it is also the hiding place for impoverished people who have lost hope and are now in search for illegal ways of survival, like drugs and prostitution. Gil Paclibare grew up here, in this backyard. Through the message about a loving God who has not forgotten the poor, Gil himself chose an alternative way of following Jesus of Nazareth. He became a pastor and started a small church. In partnership with Onesimo, together with his wife Melanie, he took 10 boys and young men into his small chapel. WORK CAMP

Traditionally held at Camp rock, Puerto Galera, Mindoro, Philippines, the Onesimo Work Camps serve as the prospective clients' introduction to life in Onesimo. Mindoro is an island 150 kms. south of Manila. There are separate camps for boys and girls. During the 10 day camps, the youth are separated from whatever addiction they may have, cigarettes, alcohol, glue, gambling, pornography, drugs, etc.

They experience the beauty of creation, camaraderie, games, nutritious food. They hear scriptures and learn how its application can positively impact their future. An integral part of the experience is hiking across mountains to visit Mangyan (people indigenous to Mindoro) villages to help distribute food and groceries.

This year, the boys camp was held from June 28 to July 13.

ONESIMO ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAM (OAEP)

OAEP IM TRAINING 2015

Every January Onesimo continues to provide logistical support to churches and communities in training Instructional Managers who can impart knowledge through the Department of Education's Alternative Learning System Program.

This is the Eighth Instructional Managers Training sponsored by Onesimo. Authorities from DepEd once again lent their time and expertise so that out of school youth and even adults from slum and poor communities can avail of educational upgrades through the ALS programs.

Classroom training was augmented by exposure in slum community conditions.



31 participants from different churches, organizations and communities completed the 8th Onesimo I.M. Training from January 26 –30 2015

CBM - MONTHLY YOUTH GATHERING

The Monthly Youth Gathering is one of the most awaited outdoor activities for beneficiaries every month. The primary purpose of the activity is worshipping God together. Secondly, to build a strong fellowship among themselves and to divert their traumas by creating memories that will be treasured and is fulfilled through creative and resourceful activity — promoting friendship and fellowship through games, action songs, talent presentations, Praise and Worship, praying together, and listening to and learning from the Word of God.

Previously the venue for the monthly gathering rotated amongst the clusters. But difficulty of transport resulted in making the Quezon City Circle Ampitheater the permanent venue because it is central to all the churches.

CHURCH BASED MINISTRY (CBM)

WORKERS FELLOWSHIP

The CBM team, in reaction to the needs assessment of the youth workers, changed the mode of the Monthly Workers' Fellowship. This year, we provided more opportunities to de-stress and refresh.

Since the workers are the front-liners of the program, there is a greater possibility for them to give up on the ministry due to the difficulty of their work, handling problem youth. The program relies so much on their ability to keep healthy, spiritually, emotionally and physically.

The Workers Monthly Fellowship is not anymore a 2-3 hour activity similar to the Monthly Gathering. It is now a full-blown outdoor retreat, at least whole day and sometimes overnight. We take the workers to refreshing venues like Matalinting Camp Site, Tagaytay City, Dado's Resort in Montalban, Pililia Windmill and Daranak Falls in Tanay Rizal. Here, they can refresh, relax, have fun and moments of fellowship with coworkers, far from the stress and pressure caused by their tasks.

PASTORS FELLOWSHIP

CHURCH BASED MINISTRY (CBM)

END RETREAT

After two years of going through the training inside the church, it is just reasonable to put a significant end to their two years program. To put a seal to it, it is good to let them experience a memorable retreat program that they will cherish and will make a mark on their stay in CBM program.

On March 16-20, 2015 the second batch of CBM beneficiaries attended the End Retreat. It is the last camp retreat that beneficiaries will undergo in order to coach them and learn about the things they need to prepare as they enter the next chapter of their journey with Christ. The objectives of the activity are the following; (1) To fully equip the CBM Beneficiaries in spiritual aspects (2) To prepare them in their eventual reintegration to their families (3) To have an in depth fellowship among them and strengthen solidarity with other CBM beneficiaries.

Their journey depends on what kind of mobilization they planned and believe they're being called – Job Placement, Small Time Business, or Pastoral Training. This also means a celebration for them as they have endured the 2-year training program. The 8 Churches were able to attend the camp while the remaining one was unable because all of their beneficiaries were already working.



PROGRAM ORIENTATION AND MOA SIGNING – NEW PARTNER CHURCHES AND CHURCH FOR RENEWAL

January and February 2015 is the month of evaluation and assessment respectively. It's for the churches that were going to end its first term and those in the middle of the term. This was also the time for the team to clarify few confusing observation. This will determine if they were qualified to renew for second term or not. Unfortunately, from the 8 Churches of 2nd batch beneficiaries 3 of them did not renew. Their partnerships were cut all because of the same reason – the Churches don't have official workers who are willing to commit for 2 years in the ministry. Having an official worker is one of the major requirements in partnering with Onesimo CBM Program. Contrary to expectations, Onesimo CBM is still blessed to have found churches that are willing to adopt and passionate in ministering to youth-at-risk. 10 Churches became the new partner of Onesimo in having a Church Based Ministry Program in their respective Churches, their MOA signing happened in April and May 2015.

SEMINARS: CBM PROGRAM ORIENTATION

Seminars conducted by the CBM Team, with the help of Onesimo Staff, last May 29 and June 23, were how to's of program implementation. The first seminar was all about the Residential and CBM Program orientation, Financial Matters, Important Documents to be filled-up by churches, and a brief background of Child Protection Policy. The second seminar was all about facilitation of manuals to be used during or after the rehabilitation period of beneficiaries which includes: 'Pura Pura Pai or the Good Seed' – a pattern of devotion and Bible study manual for new Christian, SWOT (Strength, Weakness, Opportunity and Threat) or the Monthly Evaluation and update of beneficiaries to be filled up by Workers and Pastors, and PELT or Personal Enhancement and Leadership Training. The said seminars were the core information of the CBM Program and a required activity attended not only for new partner churches but to old partners. This will serve as a refresher course for them.

WORK CAMP

Among all activities, the Work Camp is the most exciting of all yet the most crucial in Onesimo Church Based Ministry's attempt to intervene in the lives of Philippines's urban poor youth. It is a 5-day sheltered workshop held at His Land Resort at Sta. Maria, Bulacan on June 8-13, 2015 and July 27-30, 2015. While it is designed for the possible beneficiaries to greatly enjoy the activity and at least experience what it is to be free from the worries of daily survival away from the harsh realities that has trapped them and their families for years, it is structured in such a way that it will have lasting life-changing impact on them. Through its various structured learning activities, workshops and teaching sessions, Onesimo CBM hopes to see that participants will come to know themselves better, experience love and acceptance, appreciate the value of life itself, experience healings from their past traumas and clearly understand God's love and concern for them. 



FIRE HITS FRISCO SLUM AREA, ONESIMO BOYS CENTER BURNED

On the 1st day of the year 2015, the slum area where the very first Onesimo Center was located was hit by fire. Onesimo Frisco center was burned up. Fortunately no one died in the fire, but our clients had to be distributed to Tondo, Amlac and Bagong Silang.

Onesimo Foundation quickly reached out to help the affected families in the area, giving out more than a million pesos (P1,000,000) in food, relief, household and kitchen materials and construction materials.

SUMMARY OF ACCOMPLISHMENTS

RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM

- 98 youth were served through Residential Program; medical and dental treatment
- Around 600 individuals benefitted in the 8 batches 3-days parents retreat
- Around 400 children participated in the Daily Vacation Bible School conducted by houseparents, church volunteers and trainees
- 24 admitted to the residential program after the workcamp
- · Conducted retreat for reintegrated clients and their families

CHURCH BASED PROGRAM

- 312 youth were served through 30 Church Based Ministries residential program
- · Work camps, retreats, monthly fellowships for beneficiaries

- Provided venues for exposure and OJT for teachers and students from partner institutions

SPECIAL EVENTS

- Funded the 70 pastors and church volunteers psychosocial support training for disaster preparedness in partnership with the Asian Theological Seminary
- 900 individuals: trainees, trainee's relatives, volunteers, staff: Family Fun Day
- · 337 youth participated in the sports festival
- 100 youth were trained to lead a camp
- Six batches of 5-day camp, a total of 634 youth and workers

MINISTRY SUPPORT SERVICES

- 32 regular staff, 2 part-time; 82 volunteers with love gift
- · Assisted 31 staff families for medical and educational expenses of children and dependents
- Paid fees for permits and licenses to comply with Bureau of Internal Revenue, Securities and Exchange Commission and Dept. of Social Welfare

- Renovated Girls Center in Mendez to comply with the Dept of Social Welfare requirements
- · House purchased and renovated for Boys Center in Bagong Silang
- Installed perimeter fence in Matalinting land
- Purchased 8-seater Suzuki APV
